- Have a plan to get home safely; do not get behind the wheel if you are under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Plan your ride with someone sober before the party.
- Stay alert; stick with friends, have your phone charged, and avoid isolated or poorly lit areas. If something does not feel right, trust your instincts and go to a safe place. Do not hesitate to call 911 if you have an emergency and need help.
